Maison Gallieni is a rare opportunity to own and restore a piece of French history in the heart of the picturesque village of St B  t, just 10 minutes from the Spanish border. Birthplace of General Joseph Gallieni on 24 April 1849, this distinguished figure was a French military officer, colonial administrator, and posthumously named Marshal of France.

The house retains many original features – marble fireplaces, parquet floors, elegant staircases – and offers spacious, light-filled rooms across several levels. In need of renovation, it is perfect for someone ready to breathe new life into a grand family home, B&B, or holiday rental. It also includes a small barn ripe for conversion and a gated rear garden with parking and roof terrace with views.

From your doorstep, enjoy skiing, hiking, cycling, rafting, and mountain views.

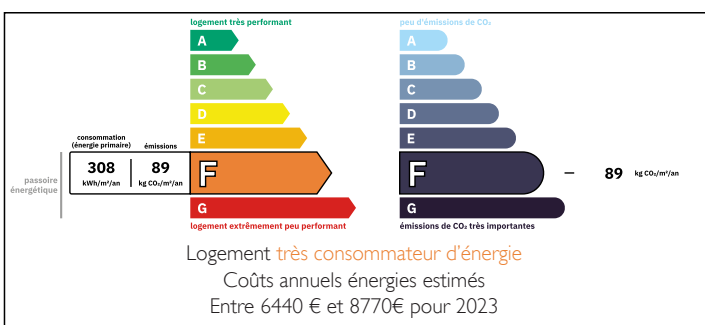
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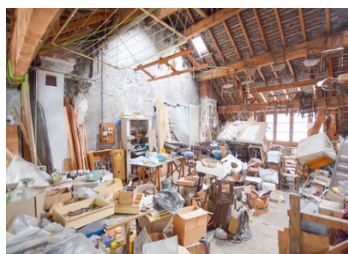

GROUND FLOOR

A wide, impressive entrance door opens into a vestibule, leading into the main entrance hall with:
