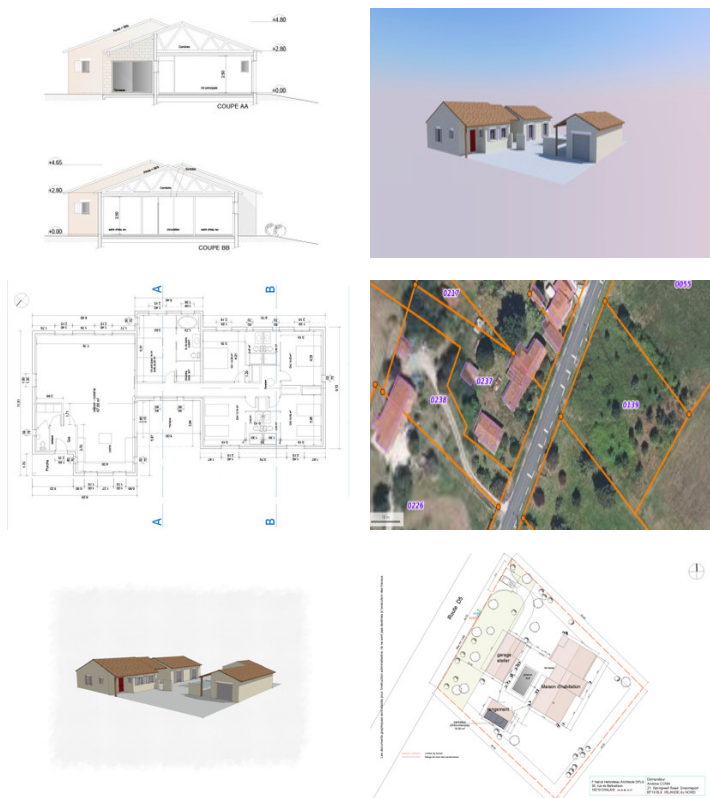

Saint-Aulaye-Puymangou is a picturesque commune in the Dordogne department of southwestern France, nestled in the Périgord Vert region. Established in 1288 as a bastide by Pierre de Brémond, it lies at the confluence of the Dronne and Rizonne rivers, marking the historical boundaries between Périgord, Angoumois, Saintonge, and Bordelais .

The village is renowned for its rich heritage, earning the "Petite Cité de Caractère" designation in 2015. Notable landmarks include the 12th-century Romanesque Church of Sainte-Eulalie, 15th-century ramparts, and the medieval Château de Saint-Aulaye, which now houses the town hall .

Saint-Aulaye-Puymangou is also recognized for its natural beauty and commitment to environmental sustainability, holding labels such as "Station Verte" and "Agenda 21: Our Village, Land of the Future" . The surrounding La Double forest and the Dronne River offer opportunities for outdoor activities like hiking, canoeing, and wildlife observation.
