Ground floor: Living room 41m with a tiled floor and with access to a cellar with vaulted ceiling. The room features a magnificent golden limestone fireplace and trompe l'œil murals.

Kitchen and dining room 41m2 with original golden limestone floor, magnificent fireplace and the original golden limestone sink.

1st floor: 2 beautiful bedrooms of 41m2 with original doors, feature fireplaces and magnificent coffered ceilings.

2nd floor 2 more beautiful 41m2 bedrooms with

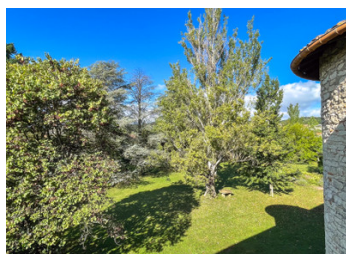

Historic Renaissance Manor House - Morancé, Beaujolais

A Rare Piece of French Renaissance Heritage

Dating from 1574, this extraordinary "Maison Forte" represents one of the finest examples of French Renaissance domestic architecture in the Pierres Dorées region. Built along ancient Roman trading routes in an area historically known as "Les Templiers," this remarkable property combines authentic 16th-century craftsmanship with the timeless beauty of golden limestone architecture.

Architectural Significance

The manor showcases the sophisticated integration of Italian Renaissance principles with French building traditions that characterised the late 16th century. The date 1574 was carved into one of the original chimneys, confirming its construction during the height of the French Renaissance when Lyon had become "the most Italian of French cities" due to extensive trade and cultural exchange with Italy.

The building's most striking feature is its central stone staircase, described by architectural historians as "straight in the Italian manner, with Tuscan half-columns and beautiful vaults in golden stone." The carved capitals display concentric circular moldings characteristic of the French interpretation of classical orders, while the semicircular arches create an elegant loggia typical of Renaissance manor houses.

Entrance Hall: Entry through the original Renaissance door leads into a magnificent hallway featuring the original limestone floor and a stunning wall-end column with intricately carved concentric capitals and base, all executed in the luminous golden limestone for which the region is famous.
