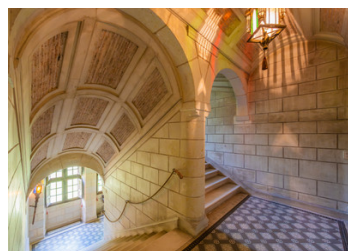
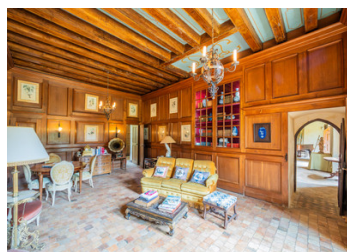

IN BRIEF

Few properties combine architectural significance, exceptional authenticity and such an enchanting setting.

Set at the end of a majestic tree-lined avenue in the gentle countryside of Anjou, this elegant Renaissance château has evolved over almost six centuries while preserving the harmony of its original design. Built from the fifteenth century and enhanced during the Renaissance, it offers around 850 m² of beautifully proportioned accommodation, remarkable historic interiors including painted and panelled rooms protected as Monuments Historiques, and an estate extending to almost 34 hectares of parkland, woodland, pasture and lakes.

The estate offers an exceptional opportunity to acquire one of Anjou's most appealing Renaissance châteaux, equally suited to private family life or a wide variety of hospitality, equestrian or lifestyle projects. Most of the furniture and decorative contents are also available by separate negotiation.

DESCRIPTION

This remarkable Renaissance property has retained both its architectural integrity and its welcoming atmosphere. Beautifully proportioned reception rooms, carefully preserved historic features and generous family accommodation combine to create a home that is as comfortable to live in as it is impressive to visit.

Built from the fifteenth century onwards and enlarged over successive generations, the château displays all the qualities expected of an important Renaissance residence. Fine stone staircases, monumental fireplaces, mullioned windows, beautifully crafted woodwork and impressive ceiling heights have all been carefully preserved, creating interiors that are both authentic and welcoming.

The accommodation extends over three principal floors with attics above and vaulted cellars below. The principal floor includes elegant reception rooms, a dining room, kitchen and service areas, while the upper floors provide fourteen bedrooms together with bathrooms, dressing rooms and additional living spaces, offering considerable flexibility for family and guests.

Among the château's most remarkable features are its beautifully preserved seventeenth-century painted rooms and decorative panelling, now protected as Monuments Historiques. These rare interiors are an important part of the property's heritage while remaining fully integrated into the life of the house.

The estate

The château is surrounded by an estate extending to almost 34 hectares. Formal lawns and mature specimen trees immediately surround the house before giving way to woodland, open pasture and lakes, creating an ever-changing landscape rich in wildlife and offering exceptional privacy.

The former stable courtyard provides extensive
