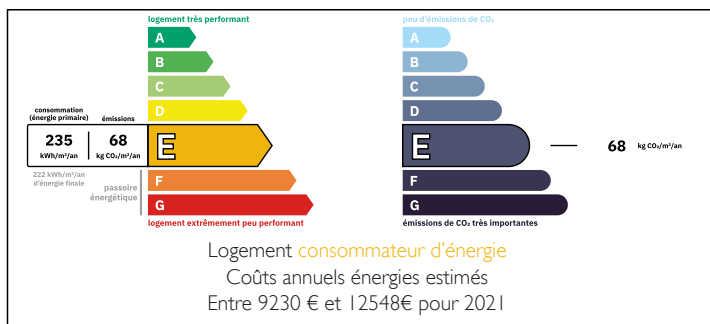

Furthermore, its adjoining outbuildings – including the former dovecote – set within 3.2 hectares of grounds will enable you to bring your plans to life,

DESCRIPTION

As we pass through the grand wrought-iron entrance gate, the manor house comes into view, standing majestically at the very end of the central driveway lined with century-old trees. A path winds its way all the way round the grounds. We are utterly charmed – as you will be too – by this architecture of such great elegance! After strolling past the flowerbeds, we push open THE solid wooden front door, adorned with its door knocker – the tone is set!

And there, we stand open-mouthed before a sublime entrance hall, with French-style ceilings and spacious terracotta floor tiles!!!

This leads off to the right wing to a 42 m² dining room with a fireplace and herringbone parquet flooring, and large windows overlooking the courtyard on the entrance side – what a magnificent room!

Extending from this is a first 23 m² living room, equally elegant, opening onto the lower rear courtyard on the Agout side. Next come two small sitting rooms, a kitchen and its pantry. Back in the main entrance hall, there is a 33 m² study and library with splendid wood panelling, and an equally spacious games room opening onto a side terrace and the rear courtyard. Note that the layout on this ground floor is circular and interconnected. A boiler room with an oil-fired boiler and a bathroom with WC are also located here.

We take the staircase, which splits into two landings. The upper floor comprises five magnificent, light-filled bedrooms, each with its...
